## **UNIFORM REMINDER 2018/2019**

Another uniform delivery has arrived and it is therefore an opportune moment to remind you about student dress. We are aware that the late arrival of orders has slowed the transition into the new uniform down and do take this into account in our discussions with pupils.

### SENIOR STUDENTS : YEARS 11 AND 12

#### BOYS:

School items purchased from the uniform shop;

- a. waistcoat
- b. blazer for formal occasions or cold weather
- c. white shirt
- d. tie and
- e. Trousers.

#### GIRLS

- a. As for the boys except they may wear a school skirt instead

Year 12 students may wear Graduation Jackets from a date agreed with the Executive Principal.

### STUDENTS : YEARS 6 TO 10

Students must wear shirts and trousers purchased from the uniform shop. Girls may wear school skirts if desired.

## **GENERAL**

Shirts must be tucked in and **shoes must be black, polishable** and, if they have laces, these must be black. They should not have white rimmed soles. Heels should be appropriate to school. Girls may wear blue, black or white headscarves as desired. No bandanas, visible bracelets or necklaces are permitted. Hoodies must not be worn to school. Coats should be removed and placed in lockers on arrival. When students have PE, their kit should be bought with them, not worn to school. This particularly includes PE shorts.

Hair must be of a natural colour and style judged by the Principal, his Deputy or Assistant to be appropriate to school. Nail polish and piercings are not allowed but students may wear no more than one stud in each ear. Makeup if worn, must be only foundation.

As a top International School we expect our students' appearance to reflect our expectations. Please be aware that students who fail to live up to these standards may be sent home to change. We look forward to your support and cooperation in ensuring that your children continue to be good role models.
